## Parking

Thank you for taking on board my email regarding safe and legal parking in the local area. It is not only important that we are considerate of the impact that illegal parking can have on local residents or other parents, but it is also vital that we consider the safety of children when they come to and leave school.

As we start our new half-term, please remember: 1. Please do not obstruct the driveways of local residents.

- 2. Please do not park in the "Keep Clear" zone in Mossbank Avenue.
- 3. The single yellow line has clearly posted parking restrictions during drop-off and collection times so parking here is illegal and would result in a fine.
- Parking on the corner or on the pavement makes an obstruction to pedestrians that puts them in greater risk of an accident.
