





Diwali - a Hindu celebration of light. A festival to remember the story of Rama and Sita.





Draw a picture of your favourite character from the story of Rama and Sita. Can you design and draw a chalk Rangoli pattern in your garden or on your drive?





Physical Development: Gross and Fine Motor Skills

A range of equipment and toys that target gross and fine motor development are available in the classroom provision. We will be covering gymnastics to begin with in our weekly PE lessons.

Squiggle Wiggle - gross and find motor movements using circles, spirals and arches.

Dough Disco - fine motor control using playdough to practice finger exercises to music. This strengthens the hand muscles for writing.

Mathematics: Numbers 1–10

One to one correspondence assigning one number name to each object that is being counted.

The cardinal principle - understanding that the number assigned to the final object in a group is the total number of objects in that group.













We will be exploring different ways of representing each number up to 10.





We will learn to use a 5 and 10 frame to represent numbers.




Music

Literacy: Reading and Writing

Phonics:




Oral segmenting - this is when you split a word into its individual sounds (c-a-t). We call this 'Fred talk'. Fred is a frog puppet used in phonics lessons.



Oral blending - this is when you blend the sounds together to say the word (cat). We use 'Fred fingers' to help with blending in phonics lessons.



At home, practice segmenting words for your child to blend, e.g., "Can you go to b-e-d?" (bed) or "Drink your m-i-l-k" (milk).



We will be learning the sounds (phonemes) for each letter of the alphabet, linking each sound to its letter (grapheme).

We will also be learning a handwriting rhyme for each letter to help with pre-cursive letter formation.

We will be learning to read simple words. Look at the word, add the sound buttons. sound it out and then blend to read.



We will be labelling pictures hat by writing the first sound (initial sound) and progressing to all of the saunds in arder.

Can you practice writing each letter using the letter formation cards that have been sent home? Can you label some of your toys using the initial sound? Progress to writing as many sounds as you can hear, in order.
